

Harvest Appeal 2017



This year's appeal is to raise as much money as possible for the construction of a 2 classroom block similar to the current classroom on the right. This building is designed for 40 pupils but the school population is now 120. Some pupils are taught under trees and the parents have built a temporary building of wood with a tarpaulin roof. .

Within the next 2 years 2 buildings and teacher's accommodation are necessary. This should accommodate the current school population with some room for expansion.

The aim for this year is for 1 building at a total estimated cost of €9,273. The school parents and village will provide materials and labour worth €1,855. We need to raise €7,418. The target for this appeal is €3,709 and we will apply for a matching grant of €3,709 from a donor organisation for the balance.

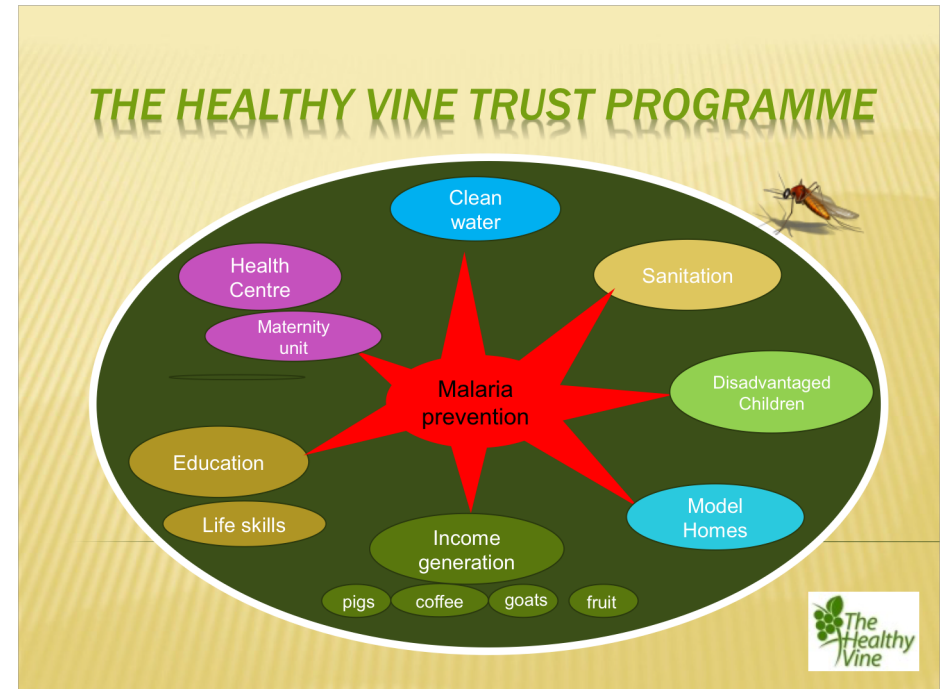
