PEACEBUILDING, TRAUMA HEALING & RECONCILIATION TRAINING

The training for church leaders, youth & women leaders and elders took place on 12 – 16 June 2017 in the Bidibidi, South Sudanese Refugees Settlement in Yumbe District, Northern Uganda.

This 5-day workshop drew together 27 participants from the Bidi-bidi (largest in the World) - Swinga, Yoyo & Rhino Camps & covered topics such as trauma healing, peacebuilding, conflict resolution, conflict management, behaviourial changes, etc. More importantly, biblical passages were used as guiding principles for many of the concepts and skills taught.

At the end of the workshop, participants took away with them motivation, knowledge & skills on how to effectively help the vulnerable communities to recover from trauma & to prevent conflicts arising in the refugee camps. Little did we know how important these first steps are in rebuilding communities torn apart by conflicts, fighting & civil wars! "If it was not their [STAD & StJStP] open support, this training wouldn't have taken place.
